

Envisioning resilient cities for a post-pandemic One Health future

The book *Envisioning resilient cities for a post-pandemic One Health future* aims to propose research advancements and key messages emerging from the conference debate/dialogues on Urban Resilience and One-Health strongly rooted in the hybridization and interdisciplinary principles.

A section devoted to Urban Resilience and One Health reframing will introduce the scientific publication, emphasizing the synergies and principal advancements that emerged from Conference participants' contributions.

The core book is dedicated to research advancements presented by the full papers received and selected (Chapters) articulated along the Conference domains.

The book aims to outline a set of key messages in terms of perspectives, priorities, strategies, and toolboxes for actions addressed to a large audience and specific stakeholder target emphasizing their possible commitment and role in boosting urban resilience and in approaching the urban transformation based on the one health principles (policies makers, professional /experts, association and citizens).

Both the reframing introduction and the key messages section are based on the collective contribution of participants in the UROH conference and reframed by editors with the support of the scientific committees of the UROH conference and of the ResilienceLAB association.

For these reasons in the registration form, we ask all participants to provide a "personal" definition/reframing on Urban Resilience and One Health and suggest one key message explicitly addressed to the targeted stakeholders.

Chapter (full paper) call

The deadline for chapter proposal submission is 12 September 2021



4. Upload/Update the submission version of the full paper for the book *Envisioning resilient cities for a post-pandemic One Health future*

In general, the full papers/chapters proposal should have a total length between 12 and 16 A4 pages, including images, tables, and bibliography. The single A4 page should have an indicative number of 3,000 characters, including spaces.

The full paper/chapter proposal will be selected according to a double-blinded peer-review procedure and book editors' evaluation with the support of the advice of the scientific committee of the UROH International Conference and the RESilienceLAB scientific committee.
